**Updated Mission Statement and Values**

The group reviewed the updated Mission Statement and Values. We agreed these reflected the desire of the full committee.

**Review of Current Resources**

We reviewed basic details about the district's facilities, including construction dates of 1970-OHS, 1991-OMS, 2009-ONE, and misc. for OWE and OSE with additions/updating in 2009. We also reviewed how far we have come with security, having all of our facilities and buses covered by security cameras.

From a technology standpoint, we have a number of different devices that we are supporting across grade levels and buildings. Some of them include: desktops, laptop PC's, chromebooks, iPads, Mac Desktops, Macbook Pros, Android tablets, and document cameras. In total, we have a total ratio of students to devices at approximately 1.2 to 1 (approximately 2250 devices and 1850 students).

**Academic Tenacity Article**

The group reviewed the *Academic Tenacity* article, and identified the following key ideas:

- teaching perseverance is critical
- adding the word "yet" to student vocab is a great strategy (ex. I can't do this "yet.")
- it is ok to struggle...that's when learning occurs
- the power of belonging can have a dramatic effect on tenacity
- learning must be relevant to the student
- learning agility is an important skill for students
- praising student effort (rather than outcomes) focuses on learning
- task complexity is critical to fostering high-level skill building

### **Digital Learning Readiness Report**

The group reviewed the Digital Learning Readiness Report and noted that the district's infrastructure and data-privacy policies and practices are very strong. However, our use of space and time in a flexible manner should be examined to allow for more flexible learning conditions.

### **Personalized Learning: A Blueprint for Success**

The group reviewed the *Personalized Learning* article, and identified the following key ideas:

- learning should be individualized to the student's needs
- learning environments should be student-centered
- we must be "adaptable" to the learning needs of students
- we should foster student ownership of their learning and progress
- our practices should be evidence-based
- we cannot be afraid to think "outside the box" for classroom space, learning times, etc.

### **Dream Big**

After "dreaming" for a few minutes about the possibilities for the future, two items surfaced repeatedly:

- technology should be available to students when it is needed and in a consistent platform
- we need to re-think the tradition classroom design, layout, and furnishing
